MATCHUP WITH THE DRAGONS

ABOUT THE DRAGONS

The New York Dragons enter their eighth season in the Arena Football League, having made the playoffs four out of the past seven years. Last year they finished fourth in the National Conference's Eastern Division at 5-11. The Dragons' offense is lead by quarterback Aaron Garcia, who is fourth all-time in AFL history in touchdown passes (803) and passing yards (37,835). Despite playing in just six games in 2007 due to injury, Garcia still finished the year with 45 touchdown passes and only four interceptions. Last season the New York defense was able to snag 18 interceptions, but the team gave up 41 turnovers to finish second-to-last in the league with a -18 turnover margin.



THE COACHES

CLEVELAND GLADIATORS - MIKE WILPOLT



Mike Wilpolt, one of the premier defensive minds in the Arena Football League, was named head coach of the Las Vegas Gladiators on September 9, 2007. Wilpolt made the transition to Cleveland with the team, and will lead the Cleveland Gladiators in their inaugural season of AFL action. Wilpolt most recently finished his second season as the defensive coordinator with the Los Angeles Avengers. In 2007, his defense ranked fifth in the league in rushing yards allowed with 231 and tied for third with an average of two yards per carry. The defense finished 10th with 848 yards. Prior to joining the Avengers, Wilpolt dramatically turned around the fortunes of the Indiana Firebirds. He took over as the head coach of the Firebirds in March of 2004, after the team lost its first five games under the direction of Steve DeBerg. Wilpolt responded immediately by leading Indiana to six consecutive victories and into playoff contention. The Firebirds ended the 2004 season at 8-8, giving Wilpolt an 8-3 record and establishing him as a finalist for the AFL's "Coach of the Year" award.

NEW YORK DRAGONS - WEYLAN HARDING



Weylan Harding took over as head coach of the Dragons in 2005. In his first two years in the league New York won 20 games, setting the AFL mark for wins by a head coach in his first two seasons. In both the 2005 and 2006 seasons, Harding was runner-up for Coach of the Year honors. Before joining the Dragons in 2005, Harding spent the previous three seasons as the defensive coordinator/defensive backs coach for the Columbus/Buffalo franchise.

Following his career as an AFL player, Harding took his first coaching assignment with the Destroyers as their defensive backs coach for the 2000 season. The following year he coached the defensive backs for the Rochester Brigade of arenafootball2, before coming back to Buffalo in 2002. In his second season with the Destroyers in 2003 his defense lead the AFL, giving up only 219.0 yards per game. As a player, Harding was a defensive specialist for the Iowa Barnstormers - now the Dragons - Nashville and Portland before retiring with Buffalo in 2000. Harding had a standout collegiate career at Iowa State University, where he was a key component to the Cyclones' defensive unit in the early 1990s.

THE LAST TIME OUT

Monday, March 3 will mark the first-ever meeting between the "Cleveland" Gladiators and the New York Dragons. The Gladiators relocated to Cleveland from Las Vegas on October 10, 2007. Prior to the move, the Las Vegas Gladiators and New York Dragons had met seven times, with the Gladiators holding a 4-3 advantage. Now foes in the National Conference's East Division, the Gladiators and Dragons will meet twice a year. The two teams will clash on April 26, 2008 at the Nassau Coliseum in New York.

NEWS AND NOTES

PHIL-YAWSOME

There was much buzz surrounding the Gladiators signing of QB Raymond Philyaw in the off-season, and for good reason. Now with his fourth AFL team, Philyaw has thrown at least 60 touchdown passes in a single season with each of his three former teams. This includes last year, when he finished fifth in the league with 85 touchdown strikes with the Kansas City Brigade. His successful 2007 season launched him into 11th place in AFL history with 381 touchdown passes.

RECENT TRANSACTIONS

The Cleveland Gladiators added **WR Andy McCullough** on February 26. The six-year AFL veteran is entering his seventh year in the League. The team also placed **FB/LB Joshua Rue** and **OL Donovan Arp** on Injured Reserve while re-signing **WR Otis Amey** and **OL Tango McCauley** on February 25. Head Coach **Mike Wilpolt** had to cut his training camp roster down to the league-maximum 24-man roster on Saturday, February 23. Wilpolt actually trimmed it to 22 on that day. The team released **DB Terrance Joseph** and waived **QB Jason Fife** amongst others.

DEFENSIVE MINDED

A former defensive coordinator with the Los Angeles Avengers, Head Coach Mike Wilpolt couldn't have been more pleased with two of the Gladiators major acquisitions prior to the season. Most prominent was the signing of DL Silas Demary, a defensive force in the AFL during his seven-year career. His breakout season came in 2005, when he was named both Defensive Player and Lineman of the Year, leading the league and setting a new AFL single-season record with 13.5 sacks. Demary has also forced 12 fumbles in his illustrious career. Demary followed Wilpolt from Los Angeles to Cleveland. The other big defensive addition was DB Brandon Hefflin, who finished fourth in the league with 105 tackles last season with the National Conference Champion Columbus Destroyers. In just three seasons, Hefflin has tallied 266 total tackles (222 solo), along with seven interceptions and 36 passes defended.

ABOVE AVERAGE

In a league dominated by passing, the Gladiators were fortunate to pick up one of the better runners in the AFL when they signed FB/LB Marlion Jackson. Despite playing in only five games last season with the Philadelphia Soul, Jackson is currently one of only two active players in the league who rank in the AFL's top 15 all-time yards per rush average. In his four seasons, Jackson has averaged 3.9 yards per attempt. The other active player is Grand Rapids quarterback Adrian McPherson, who is first on the list with a 5.2 yard per rush average over his career.

ABOVE AVERAGE

Gladiators K Jason Ball led the AFL last season in field goals made with 17. The third year man from North Texas was the fifth leading scorer amongst kickers in the league with 141 points while with Colorado, and also hit 90 of his 105 extra point attempts.

NEWS AND NOTES

SIZE DOESN'T MATTER

Not everyone who plays professional football went to Ohio State or Notre Dame. In fact, there are six players on the Gladiators roster who played collegiately at either the Division II or Division III level. These include DL Bryant Shaw (D-II Mississippi College), WR Sakeen Wright (D-III Rowan), DL Elex Reed (D-III Mary Hardin Baylor), WR Sean Scott (D-II Millersville), FB/LB Marlion Jackson (D-II Saginaw Valley State), and DB Ryan Bowers (D-II Presbyterian College).

ROAD WARRIORS

In their inaugural season, the Gladiators will be getting a look at the country from coast to coast. Over the course of the season, the team will travel over 8,000 miles. With the exception of their game at Columbus on March 15 (142 miles), the next closest destination will be 431 miles away in Philadelphia on June 14. The rest of the grueling road schedule includes the March 21 contest at New Orleans (1,052 miles), April 5 at Dallas (1,183 miles), May 17 at Colorado (1,332 miles), and May 23 at Tampa Bay (1,096 miles). The longest trip of the year will be when the Gladiators travel 2,347 miles to Los Angeles to take on the Avengers on April 19. With the following game 462 miles away at New York on April 26, the Gladiators will have traveled over 2,800 miles in one week, which is their longest back-to-back stretch of the season.

FOLLOW THE LEADER

Gladiators Offensive Coordinator Brian Partlow is recognized as one of the best offensive minds in the Arena Football League. His offenses have had great success in each of his coaching stops, which include Albany and Indiana from 2000-2003, Colorado from 2004-2006, and Austin in 2007. With this successful track record in mind, as well as the possibility to put up more big numbers this season, it should come as no surprise that five former Partlow disciples wanted to join the Gladiators this year. Wide receiver Otis Amey and OL Craig Heimberger played for Partlow last season in Austin when he was the Wranglers' head coach. Both of the Gladiators quarterbacks, AFL veterans Raymond Philyaw and Jose Davis, have played for Partlow in the past. A young Philyaw was mentored by Partlow in Albany and Indiana from 2000-2003. Davis also played with the Firebirds in 2003, in addition to being a member of the Colorado Crush from 2004-05. Wide receiver Robert Redd was a member of the Crush in 2004, and OL Craig Heimberger also played with Colorado in 2006.

FOLLOW THE LEADER

For the first time in its 22-year history, the AFL kicks off on February 29, the last day of the month during a leap year. With that, the AFL becomes the first professional sports league to begin its season on this date. On February 29, 2004 10 teams played in Week 4 of the AFL season. The Detroit Dive (1988, 1992), Tampa Bay Storm (1996), Orlando Predators (2000), and San Jose SaberCats (2004) have won ArenaBowls during leap years.

BARLEY ANY LEFTOVERS

When the Gladiators take the field on March 3rd, only three players on the current roster made the move to Cleveland from Las Vegas. **FB/LB Joshua Rue** (IR), **FB/LB Marlion Jackson** and **LB/DL Karon Riley** are the only three players who spent time in the Sin City. Head Coach **Mike Wilpolt** and President & CEO **Bernie Kosar** completely revamped the 2008 Gladiators roster when the team made the move. Kosar and Wilpolt brought in an abundance of talent - both through free agency and the dispersal draft.

EXPERIENCE A PLUS

The Cleveland Gladiators roster is comprised of some of the top talents in the Arena Football League. 13 players on the current roster have all had NFL experience at some point during their professional careers. **OL Craig Heimburger** leads the pack, having spent time with four different NFL teams.
