BATTLE OF THE BUCKEYE STATE

This week's match-up between the Gladiators and Destroyers is being dubbed as the "Battle of the Buckeye State." Not only will this mark the first game between teams from the two cities in AFL history, but it will be the first ever contest between teams from Cleveland and Columbus in professional sports history. Ironically, the last time Cleveland had a team in Arena Football the franchise moved there from Columbus. The Thunderbolts made the move in following the 1991 campaign, after just one year in Ohio's capital, but eventually folded after the 1994 season. In the four year existence of the Thunderbolts, the franchise had an abysmal 8-36 overall record. Those days of ineptitude are long gone. The Destroyers are coming off a year in which they earned their first ever National Conference Championship, and the Gladiators currently sit atop the Eastern Division at 2-0.

MATCHUP WITH THE DESTROYERS

THE COACHES

CLEVELAND GLADIATORS - MIKE WILPOLT



Mike Wilpolt, one of the premier defensive minds in the Arena Football League, was named head coach of the Las Vegas Gladiators on September 9, 2007. Wilpolt made the transition to Cleveland with the team, and will lead the Cleveland Gladiators in their inaugural season of AFL action. Wilpolt most recently finished his third season as the defensive coordinator with the Los Angeles Avengers. In 2007, his defense ranked fifth in the league in rushing yards allowed with 231 and tied for third with an average of two yards per carry. The defense finished 10th with 848 yards. Prior to joining the Avengers, Wilpolt dramatically turned around the fortunes of the Indiana Firebirds. He took over as the head coach of the Firebirds in March of 2004, after the team lost its first five games under the direction of Steve DeBerg. Wilpolt responded immediately by leading Indiana to six consecutive victories and into playoff contention. The Firebirds ended the 2004 season at 8-8, giving Wilpolt an 8-3 record and establishing him as a finalist for the AFL's "Coach of the Year" award.

COLUMBUS DESTROYERS - DOUG KAY

Doug Kay enters his third season as head coach of the Columbus Destroyers. Kay became the third coach in Columbus Destroyers history and the sixth in the Buffalo/Columbus franchise history in 2005. Last season, Kay guided the team to its first ever National Conference Championship and ArenaBowl appearance. He was also the first coach to lead the Destroyers to a playoff victory on June 29, 2007 in a 56-55 win over Tampa Bay. In his second season with the Destroyers, Kay orchestrated the biggest turnaround of any team in AFL history, leading a team that finished 2-14 in 2005 to an 8-8 campaign in 2006. Kay has over 40 years of football experience, including 14 seasons in the Arena Football League. Overall Kay's teams have made the postseason in 11 of his 14 seasons. Kay is guiding his third team in the AFL, having served as head coach of the Charlotte Rage in 1995 and the Carolina Cobras from 2000-2001. Prior to joining the AFL in 1993, Kay spent four seasons in the United States Football League with the Boston/New Orleans Breakers and the Tampa Bay Breakers.

ABOUT THE DESTROYERS

Following a 46-36 loss last week at Dallas, the Destroyers now sit at 0-2 on the season. Quarterback Matt Nagy threw for 202 yards on 21-of-35 passing and four touchdowns in a losing effort. His primary target was WR Derek Lee, who caught all four touchdowns, and finished with nine receptions for 131 yards. Rookie WR Calvin Russell displayed his versatility, as he totaled 134 all-purpose yards. The majority of Russell's yardage came on kickoff returns (97), but he also added four catches for 33 yards as well as one rush for four yards. Defensively, DB Nate Coggins led the charge, recording a team-high 8.5 tackles to go along with three pass breakups. Though still very early in the season, another loss would be damaging to the Destroyers, considering their division, the National Conference's Eastern Division, is shaping up to be the toughest in the league. Through the first two weeks of the season, three out of the five teams in the Eastern division stand at 2-0, including this week's opponent, the Gladiators.

THE LAST TIME OUT

The Cleveland Gladiators and Columbus Destroyers will meet for the first time in Cleveland Gladiators history on Saturday night. This game will mark the 12th match-up between the two franchises, dating back to 1999 when the Destroyers were in Buffalo and the Gladiators were known as the New Jersey RedDogs. For four seasons the two teams were fierce rivals in the National Conference's Eastern Division. The Gladiators lead the all-time series seven to five. The last time these two teams met was in 2005, when the Las Vegas Gladiators defeated the Columbus Destroyers 63-34.

NEWS AND NOTES

STARTING WITH A BANG

The Cleveland Gladiators started the 2008 season with a play that will definitely go down in team history. QB Raymond Philyaw connected with WR Andy McCullough on a 37-yard touchdown strike, giving the Gladiators an early 7-0 lead. Philyaw finished the game with five touchdown passes, including two to WR Otis Amey and one each to McCullough, WR Robert Redd and FB/LB Marlion Jackson.

RUNNING WILD

FB/LB Marlion Jackson had an opening night to remember. In his first game with the Cleveland Gladiators (he previously played in Las Vegas), Jackson set career highs in rushing yards and rushing attempts. On March 3rd, he ran for 62 yards on seven attempts and two touchdowns. His previous career-bests were six carries (April 14, 2006 at San Jose) and 53 yards (May 14, 2005 at Los Angeles).

REWARDED

WR/DB Robert Redd earned Ironman of the Week honors for his performance in Week 2 versus the Utah Blaze. Redd started at both wide receiver and defensive back, grabbing 105 receiving yards and three touchdowns, while adding 3.5 tackles and one fumble recovery on defense. Redd is the first Cleveland Gladiators player to garner a league award in 2008. Redd was a finalist for Ironman of the Week in Week 1 of the season as well.

MOVING ON UP

Gladiators QB Raymond Philyaw needs just five touchdown passes to tie Jay Gruden for 10th place all-time in AFL history with 397 TD passes. Here is a look at the top 10 players in AFL history for touchdown passes, and then some:

NEWS AND NOTES

MIRROR IMAGE



For the second week in a row Gladiators DL Joe Minucci and LB Karon Riley put up similar stats and played major roles in the team's win. Following the March 3 game against New York when Minucci and Riley each had two sacks, the defensive duo did it again against Utah, this time with each player recording one sack, both of them for loss. In addition to his strong play up front, Riley recorded his first career interception against the Blaze. The pick came in the third quarter off of a deflected pass, with Riley reaching up and making the play with a would-be defender draped around his waist.

SPREADING THE WEALTH

Following last Sunday's game against Utah, Gladiators QB Raymond Philyaw has now thrown touchdown passes to over 30 different receivers in his career. This year he has already connected with five different receivers for scores, including four apiece to WR/DB Robert Redd and WR Otis Amey. Considering the small roster sizes of the AFL compared to those of outdoor football leagues, this is quite an accomplishment. In 2005 Philyaw threw touchdown passes to nine different receivers while with the Chicago Rush.

REDD-HOT

Gladiators WR/DB Robert Redd put on quite a performance in the team's victory over Utah on March 9. The third-year man out of Bowling Green led all Gladiators receivers with 105 yards and three touchdowns on seven catches, including an impressive 34 yard touchdown reception. Redd also made 3.5 tackles on defense and made a momentum-swinging fumble recovery in the second quarter, making him the clear choice as the Gladiators Ironman of the Game.

UNDER PRESSURE

Not only did DE Joe Minucci and LB Karon Riley change the outcome of the game with their four combined sacks in Week One, but their two sacks apiece tied for the individual league high for the week. In addition, Minucci also tied for the league high with 2.0 tackles for loss in the Gladiators win.

WELL THAT'S OFFENSIVE

While still only two games old, it's clear that offensive coordinator Brian Partlow has wasted no time in bringing his patented high-scoring attack to the Gladiators this season. Through the first two weeks, the Gladiators are in the top three in the league in three different offensive categories as a team. They currently sit in second place in the AFL in points per game with 63.5, behind only Philadelphia's 68.5, third in touchdowns scored with 17, and third in average yards per play at 7.0.

IT'S GOOD!

With 25 points scored this season, Cleveland K Jason Ball leads the league in points by a kicker. So far this year Ball has made 13-of-17 PATs, two of which were blocked, and has hit on four-of-five field goals. His 46-yarder as time expired in the first half of the Gladiators game with Utah gave the home team a 32-29 lead going into halftime.

WIDE LOAD

For the second time in his five-year career, Gladiators OL/DL Ramon Richardson scored a rushing touchdown against the Utah Blaze on March 9. His score came on a fourth and goal play from Utah's one yard-line. Richardson's first rushing touchdown came against the Los Angeles Avengers in 2005. Although not uncommon for offensive linemen to score touchdowns in the AFL, Richardson has proven to be very reliable when called upon. He has scored at least one offensive touchdown in each of his first four seasons prior to this year, four of those coming through the air.

THE WRIGHT STUFF

A week after recording the first interception in Cleveland Gladiators history, WR/LB Sakeen Wright picked up where he left off against Utah in Week Two. Wright intercepted a Joe Germaine pass and returned it seven yards for a touchdown midway through the second quarter in the Gladiators 66-63 win over the Blaze. It was Wright's first career interception return for a touchdown. He also forced a fumble and recorded 3.5 tackles. His impressive performance earned him Defensive Player of the Game honors. Wright's two interceptions are already one more than his season total last year with Austin.



LESSONS LEARNED

After their first game, Gladiators players and coaches were openly frustrated and disappointed about their apparent lack of discipline in committing a league high 13 penalties for 111 yards, five of those calls coming on defensive offsides. Whatever they changed in the week leading up their matchup with Utah worked, as the Gladiators cut both totals by more than half. Against the Blaze, Cleveland committed only six penalties for 43 yards, with just one coming on an offsides call.

NOSE FOR THE BALL

Gladiators DB Brandon Hefflin has wasted no time this season making a case for himself as the top tackler in the AFL. After racking up 10.5 tackles against the New York Dragons in Week One, Hefflin again led both teams with nine tackles in the Gladiators 66-63 win over Utah. For the season, Hefflin now has 19.5 tackles, 17 of which are solo stops, and currently sits in second place in the league behind Tampa Bay's Jeroid Johnson who has 20.5 tackles.

NEWS AND NOTES

SIZE DOESN'T MATTER

Not everyone who plays professional football went to Ohio State or Notre Dame. In fact, there are six players on the Gladiators roster who played collegiately at either the Division II or Division III level. These include DL Bryant Shaw (D-II Mississippi College), WR Sakeen Wright (D-III Rowan), DL Elex Reed (D-III Mary Hardin Baylor), WR Sean Scott (D-II Millersville), FB/LB Marlion Jackson (D-II Saginaw Valley State), and DB Ryan Bowers (D-II Presbyterian College).

BARELY ANY LEFTOVERS

When the Gladiators take the field on March 3rd, only three players on the current roster made the move to Cleveland from Las Vegas. FB/LB Joshua Rue (IR), FB/LB Marlion Jackson and LB/DL Karon Riley are the only three players who spent time in the Sin City. Head Coach Mike Wilpolt and President & CEO Bernie Kosar completely revamped the 2008 Gladiators roster when the team made the move. Kosar and Wilpolt brought in an abundance of talent - both through free agency and the dispersal draft.

FOLLOW THE LEADER

Gladiators Offensive Coordinator Brian Partlow is recognized as one of the best offensive minds in the Arena Football League. His offenses have had great success in each of his coaching stops, which include Albany and Indiana from 2000-2003, Colorado from 2004-2006, and Austin in 2007. With this successful track record in mind, as well as the possibility to put up more big numbers this season, it should come as no surprise that five former Partlow disciples wanted to join the Gladiators this year. Wide receiver Otis Amey and OL Craig Heimburger played for Partlow last season in Austin when he was the Wranglers' head coach. Both of the Gladiators quarterbacks, AFL veterans Raymond Philyaw and Jose Davis, have played for Partlow in the past. A young Philyaw was mentored by Partlow in Albany and Indiana from 2000-2003. Davis also played with the Firebirds in 2003, in addition to being a member of the Colorado Crush from 2004-05. Wide receiver Robert Redd was a member of the Crush in 2004, and OL Craig Heimburger also played with Colorado in 2006.

ONCE EVERY FOUR YEARS

For the first time in its 22-year history, the AFL kicked off on February 29, the last day of the month during a leap year. With that, the AFL becomes the first professional sports league to begin its season on this date. On February 29, 2004 10 teams played in Week 4 of the AFL season. The Detroit Dive (1988, 1992), Tampa Bay Storm (1996), Orlando Predators (2000), and San Jose SaberCats (2004) have won ArenaBowls during leap years.

WHAT A START

In front of over 17,391 fans in their Inaugural Game, the Gladiators wasted no time in giving their fans something to cheer about. On the team's first-ever play from scrimmage, QB Raymond Philyaw hit WR Andy McCullough for a 37 yard touchdown pass. It seems fitting that two of the players on the Gladiators with the most AFL experience (eight years for Philyaw and six for McCullough) would lead the team to its first touchdown. For McCullough, it marks the fifth different AFL franchise that he has caught a touchdown for, while Philyaw has thrown touchdowns for four different franchises.

ROAD WARRIORS

In their inaugural season, the Gladiators will be getting a look at the country from coast to coast. Over the course of the season, the team will travel over 8,000 miles. With the exception of their game at Columbus on March 15 (142 miles), the next closest destination will be 431 miles away in Philadelphia on June 14. The rest of the grueling road schedule includes the March 21 contest at New Orleans (1,052 miles), April 5 at Dallas (1,183 miles), May 17 at Colorado (1,332 miles), and May 23 at Tampa Bay (1,096 miles). The longest trip of the year will be when the Gladiators travel 2,347 miles to Los Angeles to take on the Avengers on April 19. With the following game 462 miles away at New York on April 26, the Gladiators will have traveled over 2,800 miles in one week, which is their longest back-to-back stretch of the season.

EXPERIENCE A PLUS

The Cleveland Gladiators roster is comprised of some of the top talents in the Arena Football League. 13 players on the current roster have all had NFL experience at some point during their professional careers. OL Craig Heimburger leads the pack, having spent time with four different NFL teams. Here is a look at the current players and where they've been:
